Commercial

Hazel has assisted in a wide range of complex and international commercial matters of a high value during pupillage. She welcomes all commercial instructions. Examples of such work, where she has assisted her pupil supervisor, include:

- The Federal Republic of Nigeria v JP Morgan Chase Bank [2019] EWHC 347 (summary judgment application on whether the bank owed a Quincecare duty of care).
- Cathay Pacific Airlines v Lufthansa Technik AG [2019] EWHC 484 (whether a multi-million contractual dispute was properly allocated within Part 7 or Part 8).
- Omers Administration Corp & Ors v Tesco [2019] EWHC 109 (representing the SFO in the Tesco overstatement of profits claim).

EU & Competition Law

Hazel had experience as a pupil assisting in a range of EU/competition cases, including:

• The CAT's preliminary reference to the CJEU in the appeal of a finding of infringement of alleged 'pay for delay' settlement of patent litigation in respect of paroxetine.

Hazel continues to assist members of Chambers advising on matters relating to the law of the EU.

Public and Administrative Law

Hazel welcomes instructions relating to matters of Public and Administrative law. During pupillage, she assisted with a wide range of public law issues in both an advisory and contentious context. The work for her pupil supervisors included:

- R (Utilita) v BEIS (a challenge in respect of Smartmeters, involving questions of EU energy and environmental law).
- *R (El Gizouli) v Home Secretary* [2019] EWHC 60 (a challenge to the Home Secretary's decision to share evidence with the USA without requiring a death penalty assurance).
- *R (ICAEW) v Lord Chancellor* [2019] EWHC 461 (a challenge to the Lord Chancellor's decision not to allow the ICAEW to regulate legal services).
- Grounds of appeal against a decision concerning breach of substantive legitimate expectation.

Group Actions and Product Liability

Hazel completed a research assessment during pupillage assisting counsel in a large group action. She will continue to assist members of Chambers in this work throughout her third six.

Property

Hazel welcomes instructions in relation to property disputes including injunction applications, possession claims, and other procedural matters.

Personal Injury
