Rachel has a broad commercial litigation practice, with a focus on commercial disputes, product liability, group actions and personal injury. She regularly appears in court, at both trial and appellate level, and is equally at home working as sole counsel or as a member of a larger team. She is recommended as a leading junior for commercial litigation by the Legal 500 and for group litigation by Chambers & Partners.

Recent instructions include: representing multiple defendants in a conspiracy claim arising out of joint venture arrangements brought by the Libyan Investment Authority; acting as first junior for the Claimant Steering Committee in the Volkswagen Emissions Litigation; advising and acting for parties in a variety of other group actions arising out of the 2015 "Dieselgate" scandal; advising in the early stages of a high value ad hoc arbitration relating to the collapse of a partnership; and acting for a litigation funder in a complex commercial conspiracy claim proceeding in the Supreme Court in Gibraltar.

She regularly represents Claimants and Defendants in a wide variety of personal injury claims. Rachel also has an interest in vexatious & abusive litigation and fraud across all areas of her practice. She has recently been commissioned by OUP to author a new book on abuse of process in the civil courts.

Prior to coming to the bar, Rachel was an advertising executive at one of London's leading independent media agencies, and also worked as an adjudicator at the Financial Ombudsman Service, specialising in banking and insurance disputes. Her experience in those fields enables her to bring pragmatism and a commercially-sensitive approach to litigation.

Rachel is a Visiting Lecturer at City University where she teaches civil litigation. She is a benefactors' scholar of Middle Temple and a former Judicial Assistant to Mummery LJ in the Court of Appeal.

## Commercial and Insurance

Rachel is an experienced commercial junior who has acted in a range of disputes, often as sole counsel. She is recommended as a leading junior for commercial litigation by the legal 500.

She has particular interest and expertise in conspiracy, fraud, and issues of contractual interpretation. However, her practice covers the full spectrum of commercial work, including:

- Banking and finance
- Civil fraud, asset tracing and enforcement
- Contractual claims
- Debt recovery
- Insurance (including policy coverage, subrogation, fraud, and Bermuda form issues)
- Injunctive relief
- Insolvency
- Partnership, shareholder, and joint venture disputes
- Sale of goods and chains of supply

Rachel's work is increasingly international; she accepts instructions from offshore jurisdictions and has been involved in various cases with European, American, African and Caribbean dimensions. She is a member of the Litigation Committee of the International Bar Association.

Whilst Rachel’s present focus is predominantly on consumer issues, she has advised and acted in a broad range of claims including those concerning medical devices, pharmaceuticals, cosmetics, food and drink, sports equipment, financial misselling, employee blacklisting, and environmental damage.

## Personal Injury

Rachel has a busy court practice in this field, and regularly represents Claimants and Defendants in a wide variety of personal injury claims, at both trial and appellate level.

Rachel is well-versed in all aspects of the QOCS regime, including fundamental dishonesty applications and fraudulent claims.
